UPDATES FOR 2024

From the President: Robert N. Ferrer, Jr., MFH:

We are excited about changes to modernize, simplify, and economize while maintaining standards for our Hound Show. This new website is one of the first initiatives. It will be our primary communication method with hunts and members of the foxhunting community and will replace mailings and printings.

Virginia Foxhound Show Mailings

In years past, we have printed and mailed the prize list to all members of the Virginia Foxhound Club (member hunts and individuals). Beginning in 2024, we will cease that very costly method of communicating that requires drafting, reviewing, printing, and mailing costs. On top of that, we routinely had 20-25 prize lists returned as undeliverable.

The same can be said of our announcement and invitation to the annual meeting and luncheon, so we will utilize our website to communicate information to our members and interested parties. This is designed to save revenue that can be used in the everincreasing costs of the Hound Show.

Virginia Foxhound Show Sponsors

Last year, we instituted a program that was very successful in requesting ring sponsors, and we will continue to do that again to help offset expenses.

Parking

I have met with the Morven Park staff to try to identify a way to enable people to park closer to the grounds, both for the dinner the night before and the day of the show, but we were unsuccessful in getting any concession in that area. However, they have agreed to our moving the tent for the dinner closer to the parking area, which, in turn, would make the pack and championship classes significantly closer to the kennels. While we would lose the backdrop of the mansion for the dinner and the pack and championship classes, it would make it significantly more convenient for people parking both in the field and the parking lot.

We would continue the bus shuttle in the morning but eliminate it for the later afternoon since people would be within walking distance to their cars – again, a cost-saving measure.

Admin & Costs

The cost of putting on this show has almost tripled over the past couple of years, and we are reluctant to increase costs on exhibitors who already spend a great deal of money coming to the show. So, we must find ways to make the show successful and pleasant for attendees but also economize.

In the past few years, we have not provided sufficient instructions to our stewards and clerks to help make the show run smoothly, so we are renewing the former practice of having a chief steward who will oversee the five rings to make them operate efficiently.

We are fortunate to have a solid Show Secretary who will continue the initiatives we have instituted over the last couple of years to make registering and making changes as easy as possible for attendees. We are also looking at improvements in other areas, which we will announce on the website.

Volunteers

We are faced, like many organizations, with an aging group of volunteers, and I am asking everyone to identify younger volunteers who can help put on the show and take it to the next level to ensure the show's continuation for generations to come. I am charging everyone to step up and make the Virginia Hound Show, the largest foxhound show in the world, the best possible event to bring together a large section of the North American foxhunting community.

Clearly, the advantage of the show is to see the top breeding in North America each year, but it also serves as a unique forum to exchange ideas and share camaraderie between foxhunters, Huntsmen, and Staff, and Masters.

Thank you for supporting the Virginia Foxhound Club and enabling it to serve the foxhunting community. We welcome everyone to participate and join us Memorial Day weekend.

Junior Handler Class

To be held at 12:00 Noon in the English Ring for 11-16 Over 25 Couple **Crossbred Ring for 10 and under**

Open to children associated with exhibiting packs: To be judged on handling and presentation of the foxhound. All hounds to be shown on lead with only one handler per hound.

Division I: Handlers 10 and under, Division II: Handlers 11-16

Children may pre-enter, post entries for these classes will be accepted at the Secretary's tent before 10:00 a.m. - no entries accepted after 10:00 a.m.

CONDITIONS

- All hounds entered in this show must be American, English, Cross-Bred or Penn-Marydel Foxhounds belonging to packs recognized or registered by the Masters of Foxhounds Association of America. ENTERED HOUNDS must have been accepted by the Keeper of the Stud Book of the M.F.H.A. and UNENTERED HOUNDS, which, for the purpose of this show, have been whelped since the prior year's report, must be eligible for acceptance by the Keeper of the Stud Book.
- In the Cross-Bred Division all classes will be divided into 2 rings. Ring 2 is designated to packs which reported less than 25 couple total in kennel. Ring 3 is designated for packs which reported 25 couple or more total in kennel.
- EACH HUNT MAY SHOW TWO (2) ENTRIES PER CLASS. A MAXIMUM OF FOUR (4) ENTRIES PER CLASS MAY BE ENTERED, ANY TWO (2) OF WHICH MAY BE SHOWN. Entries not shown should be scratched with the Secretary at least thirty minutes previous to the start of the Show.
- THE ENTRY FEE IS \$15.00 for each entry, up to two (2) for each class, except pack classes, (Maximum \$30.00 per class). The entry fee for the Pack Classes (Classes 20, 39, 66 and 91 is \$20.00 per entry). Payment of entry fees must accompany online entries.
- The Committee, by returning the entry fee, reserves the right to refuse any entry or to cancel any class that does not fill. No ribbon or cup will be given in any class failing to have entries from at least two different exhibitors. If there are not three or more entries in a class, there will be no second or third award.

• Every hunt exhibiting in this show must be a member of the Virginia Foxhound Club.

• Every entry shall be subject to the rules and regulations of the Executive Committee of the Virginia Foxhound Club. The decision of this Committee on all questions shall be final.

• All hounds must be named, giving date of entry (except in unentered classes), as well as name and date of entry of sire and dam. In the Pack Classes and Two Couple Classes individual hounds need not be named. In the Stallion Hound with Get and Brood Bitch with Produce Classes, only the stallion and brood bitch hounds need to be named.

• The champion foxhound in each division of a MFHA sanctioned show will be permitted to post enter, provided they enter the same classes as in their respective shows. Aside from this exception there will be no post entries. A total of five substitutions in any one Division may be made by any exhibitor provided this is done in writing to the Show Secretary at least thirty minutes prior to the start of the Show.
